
Curie Class Learning Blog

When children are using the internet, it is always good practice to monitor what they are doing.

Age limits for social media (Facebook, What's App, Instagram, Tik Tok, Snapchat

In Europe, most social media platforms have a minimum age of 16 (13 with parental consent) before a user can create an account, due to the General Data Protection Regulation, or GDPR, which came into effect on 25th May 2018. Please bare this in mind when you are monitoring. These recommendations are for a reason!






