Cold Weather

Current government guidelines mean that we need to keep windows or doors open around the school to enable a good

Many of you will know that St Mary's has been a stand-alone academy for several years now. Whilst it allows for a certain level of independence, it can at times be both demanding and difficult, which is particularly relevant during the challenging times that schools are currently faced with. in procuring and upgrading our whole-school technological provision, additional business support, school development conversations, training opportunities and occasions for our 'Experts' to meet (virtually) with St Benets' 'Experts' in order to share best teaching, learning and curriculum practices. We look forward still to seeing all that is yet to come and the positive impact this collaboration will have on our wonderful school community.

WHAT TO DO IF YOU THINK YOUR CHILD IS EXPERIENCING BULLYING ONLINE.

Most websites and apps have rules against bullying and harassment, and can help if it's happening to you or someone you know.

If you've seen or experienced bullying on social media, it's important to:

- report what's happened on the site or app
- block the people bullying you
- take screenshots of nasty messages, but don't reply to them
- <u>tell someone you trust</u>, like your parent, carer or a teacher.
