
# St Mary's Church of England Junior Academy

#### Learning Blog - Robin Class

In English Robin class have been doing work based on the book 'One Plastic Bag' by Miranda Paul. It is about a woman from Gambia who notices the terrible problem of plastic bags being thrown away and decides to do something about it.

In our first session the children were given plastic bags and asked to make something – this turned out to involve various items of clothing. In another session the class started to think about how they could start to prepare plastic bags in order to recycle them by making woven purses and bags (like in the book).

In science we have just finished our topic, Rocks and Soil. In the last session we had five different types of soil and we tested them to see which ones allowed water to drain the quickest and the slowest. We then examined some samples of the different soils and described the texture, structure, colour and moistness of each one. We were allowed to put our fingers in the soil to study it closely.

Our new geography topic is Europe. In the first session we identified the countries of Europe and located them on a map.
