Maths Sessions


Next week, Thursday 14th March, we would like to invite parents in for Maths sessions run by the Maths Hub. Parents will have the chance to learn maths alongside their child.

Learning Blog – 4 Kingfisher Class

It's hard to believe that we are now half way through our school year, although by looking at the children's books there is no doubt as to the excellent progress that they have all been making, a reward for learning effectively and consistently working extremely hard in every lesson we have.

In Maths, the children have been working on what is possibly the hardest mathematical concept to understand...FRACTIONS. Slowly but steadily, as a result of hour after hour of small steps in progression, the children have becoming knowledgeable and confident about equivalent fractions, adding/subtracting fractions and finding fractions of numbers. They absolutely smashed their end of unit tests and I was immensely proud of what they have achieved. Another area of Maths that we have been revisiting is telling the time, an area of Maths that they had demonstrated they weren't very confident with. Time is another tricky mathematical concept, an important life skill that many children don't have the opportunity to practice doing at home due to emergence of digital clocks/smartwatches. Despite this, we've spent 10 minutes a day working on these skills and now the children are confident with reading the time on an analogue clock...why not try them with these clocks below. In addition to this, the children are continuing to work hard developing their times tables skills in preparation for the National Year 4 Multiplication Check in May. More details of this will be shared with parents during our upcoming teacher-parent meetings.




In topic, the children have been learning all about the physical and human geography of Europe, from the countries that make up Scandinavia, all the way down to Southern Europe, looking at Italy, Year 4 have been conducting their own research, finding out about aspects of these countries such as climate, population, popular landmarks and government. Many children have been awarded Gold/Silver awards for their homework projects, which have been produced not only with a lot of care and effort but also to a very high standard. 


In computing, we have been looking at all the components that make up a computer network. We have been discussing inputs and outputs and looking at each component's function in a computer set up. As part of the topic, the children had great fun putting together their own 'gaming' set-ups, using a variety of computer components such as headsets, webcams, monitors and keyboards etc...


Finally, in music the class have just began a series of lessons being delivered by the Norfolk Music Service. In these lessons, the class are being taught by a specialist music teacher, who is teaching the children the music curriculum with Ukuleles. This week, the children have been learning how to play Bob Marley's Three Little Birds and The Yellow Submarine by The Beatles. Both of which, despite being decades old now, most seemed to know before starting! The Ukulele is such a great instrument to begin children's musical journeys with, they are both cheap to buy and relatively easy to learn, and the sight of the class strumming (and singing away) to a bit of Bob Marley is such a great sight and one that we undoubtedly need to share with parents in the near future.
