



#### Class Learning Blog – 5 Avocet Class

It has been a very busy start to year 5 in Avocet class. In English we have been studying Indian myths through reading Seasons of Splendour by Madhur Jaffrey. We are using these myths to inspire us to write a script of our own Indian myth.

We have made a positive start to our maths this year – every child in year 5 has their own maths pack with resources to help them to understand and master every single maths concept taught across year 5. Avocet have really enjoyed using these resources to demonstrate their improved understanding of maths!



All Year 6 children will be bringing home with them an envelope today regarding information about transferring to secondary school in September 2024.




