
# St Mary's Church of England Junior Academy

There will be no after-school sports clubs on offer during the final week of term, week beginning 11th December.




#### Go Red Bake Sale for Dyslexia Awareness Week


Thank you so much to all of our parents and children who both supported and baked cakes. We are so pleased to have raised £160.45. (Photos on next page).

overlays.


