



Our class teachers are keen to work closely with you. Staff are often available to pass on quick messages at the start and end of the school day.



Parent consultation meetings are also offered each term.



# Nurture Support

One of the new initiatives that we launched this year was the introduction of a new Nurture Support. This will be continuing next year in the form of New Orleans class.

Pupils will be following the same curriculum as their peers, but working as a smaller group, with activities designed to meet individual needs. There will also be a strong focus on meeting social, emotional and mental health needs.





# Special Education Needs Provision

The term **Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND)** refers to pupils who have learning difficulties or disabilities that make it significantly harder for them to learn or access education than most of their peers. A pupil with SEND will require additional, special provision to help remove **barriers to learning**.

Typical difficulties may be with:

- Reading, writing or mathematics
- Understanding information
- Expressing themselves
- Social communication
- Organization and planning
- Processing new information
- Self-regulation
- Sensory processing
- Social, emotional and mental health needs





# Special Education Needs Provision

Depending on the individual needs of the child, we will provide:

- High Quality Teaching
- An adapted or personalised curriculum
- Access to specialist equipment such as ICT and other Tools for Learning
- In-class support from a TA or other support staff
- Group-intervention programmes
- One-to-one intervention programmes
- Special Access Arrangements for exams/tests
- Assessment from a specialist professional such as an Educational Psychologist or Specialist Learning Support Teacher
- Delivery of programmes set by specialist services, such as a Speech and Language Therapist or Occupational Therapist



# Special Education Needs Provision

As the school's SENCo, I work with class teachers and TAs to identify the needs of pupils with SEND and the provision needed to meet these needs.

Please do not hesitate to contact me or come to one of the SENDCo Surgeries I will be hosting next year, if you are concerned about your child and feel that they may have a special educational need or disability.

For pupils with SEND we implement the graduated approach of assess, plan, do, review through our termly **Individual Learning Plans (ILPs)**.

# Homework

Homework is given out **every Friday** and consists of: spellings, times-tables practice, daily reading and one project-based piece of homework per topic.

A little and often approach is best.

All children will be provided with login details for TT Rockstars, Accelerated Reader/Myon and Google Classroom in September.



If your child is experiencing significant difficulty completing their homework, please arrange to speak to their class teacher.



# Free School Meals & Pupil Premium Application

Families who receive certain benefits may be eligible for free school meals. Your child is eligible for free school meals if you're in receipt of one of the following benefits:

- Universal Credit with an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400.
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guarantee element of Pension Credit
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for the four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)
- Child Tax Credit (with no Working Tax Credit) with an annual income of no more than £16,190





# Lunchtime

Year 3 & 4 eat lunch together in the hall and play together on the Lower KS2 playground. Year 5 & 6 eat separately and play on a different playground.

We can provide a school hot dinner, school packed-lunch or jacket potato. The cost for this is £2.30 per day and should be paid for using ParentMail as we are now a cashless school.

# Healthy Lunch Boxes

Alternatively, pupils can bring their own healthy lunches from home.


Following statutory guidance, the recommended contents of a healthy lunch box are:

- A good portion of starchy food e.g. bread, crackers, pasta or rice salad.
- Plenty of fruit and vegetables e.g. an apple, orange, banana, carrot sticks, small box of raisins or any other fruit or vegetable
- A portion of milk or dairy food e.g. yoghurt.
- A drink e.g. a small carton of milk, juice, squash or a bottle of water.
- One small biscuit e.g. Kit-Kat, Penguin, Club, cake bar etc. – This is equivalent to a school meal dessert.

**PLEASE DO NOT SEND YOUR CHILD WITH NUTS OR FOOD CONTAINING NUTS AS SOME PUPILS MAY HAVE ALLERGIES**

Packed lunches should not include:

- Chocolate bars or sweets
- Fizzy drinks
- Hot food






# Healthy Snacks

All children in Reception and KS1 receive a free piece of fruit or vegetables everyday as part of the Governments School Fruit and Vegetable Scheme. (This would have been provided at their Infant school).

As children move up into KS2, if they wish to have a break time snack, they are required to bring in something from home.

This should be a portion of fruit or vegetables. It should **NOT** be crisps, biscuits, chocolate or similar.

All children may have a **water bottle** in school which should hold plain water only. Sugary drinks and flavoured water will be sent home and children offered an alternative during learning time.





# Outdoor Play

This year we have been developing our outdoor space and plan to continue to do so next year, with the introduction of another Sandpit area.

In the Autumn, when we return, play times will mainly be on the hard-surface playground area but when the weather is good, we get to enjoy the field, Trim-Trail and Trampoline (which we know was very popular on the transition visits!)

We will also have Premier Sports running lunchtime clubs every day, with new sports and activities to try.





## Wrap Around Care

We offer an **After School Club** from 3:00-5:00pm every day, at a cost of £10 per child and £7.50 for additional siblings. This includes a light snack and refreshments.

**Breakfast Club** is held at Manor Field School from 7:45am with pupils escorted across the school field by a member of staff for the start of the school day. The cost of this is £4.00 per session.

You can book and pay for these services using the ParentMail app. Please note that at least 24 hours notice is required for cancellation otherwise you will still be charged.





# School Uniform

It is our school policy that all children wear school uniform when attending school, or when participating in school-organised events outside normal school hours. We ask children to wear their shirts tucked into their skirts or trousers and to take pride in their personal appearance.

Some items of uniform can be bought from the school uniform outfitters Stevensons, whilst others are easily available, at very competitive prices, at local supermarkets.

# Behaviour & Rewards

## Our Golden Rules

In St Mary's we are:

- Ready to learn
- Respectful
- Safe



## Our Reward Systems:

- **House points** are given out for academic achievements and positive behaviour.
- **Star of the week** is given out to outstanding pupils in Friday's Celebration Assembly, linked to our school's mission and values.
- Pupils are placed on the class **Above and Beyond board** for behaviour seen relating to our school's golden rules.
- **Lunchtime stickers** are given out for positive behaviour.



# Behaviour & Rewards

Behaviour management steps, if rules are not followed. We will:

1. **Remind children** how we expect them to behave, referring to our school rules.
  2. Give a clear **verbal warning** and **private conversation** with the child if necessary.
  3. If disruptive behaviour persists, the pupil will be sent to **work in the parallel class** for time to reflect, calm down and complete work. You will be informed when this has happened. Please support us by ensuring your child completes any work send home for them to finish.
- The SLT regularly monitor Records of Behaviour. If a child has been sent out of class more than three times in one week, or if specific patterns in behaviour are identified, a member of the SLT will contact you to discuss this further and identify support.

**RESTORATIVE CONFERENCING** – *Used once a child is calm to help reflect on incidence of negative behaviour.*

What happened?

What were you thinking/feeling?

What needs to happen to put it right?

What are you going to do differently next time?

The Solihull Approach 'Understanding Your Child' is a free online course available for everyone who cares for children aged 0-18 years. It's there to help you recognise emotions in yourself and your child, and helps you to see how these emotions can impact on behaviour.

The course can help increase your confidence as a parent or carer, so that difficulties encountered in everyday life are reduced by seeing a child's behaviour from their point of view. A closer relationship between you and your child can develop, resulting in a calmer and happier household for everyone.

Learning is split up into sections and you can drop in and out of the course as you need to.




# How can I help my child?
