

Year 6 Viking Workshop

We might be in lockdown but here at St Mary's we are still trying our hardest to give the children an immersive learning experience! On 15th March, Y6 had a visit from a Viking from the past (who, amazingly, managed to set up a meeting via Zoom). Amongst other things, we learned a lot about weapons, farming, violence and, best of all, how Vikings used poo! Here are some of our comments about the visit:

End of Term


