

Dear Parents and Carers

We are moving quickly towards Easter and children are working hard and learning well. Many of you have had the opportunity to meet teachers to discuss the progress of your children and Year 6 will have their meetings in the week of 28th March.

We were very pleased to welcome several adults into school for our France Trip briefing earlier in the week. Mr Roberts gave a talk on the aims and expectations of this exciting opportunity for our pupils in Years 5 and 6. The visit looks full of promise for a very positive first trip abroad for many. We really hope that COVID rules continue without change so that we are able to have a successful French adventure.

We have started an important computing project across the school and children are learning about the power of IT and the importance of keeping themselves safe online. The learning will cover many aspects of computing, the use of the Internet, programming and APPs.

We are busy preparing for our Easter celebrations with songs being learnt and Easter Wreaths based on the Stations of the Cross made in each class. We intend to present the Wreaths to St. Mary's church at the end of term and our learning ambassadors will be walking to the church to take them.

We have received some impressive designs for the refurbishment of the library and are now considering affordability, everything is much more expensive than anticipated!

We hope that the children have all had a good day dressed in something red for Comic Relief today.

Class Learning Blog – 5Mumbai Class


Look at what we have been learning this week...

In English this week we are continuing to look at the book Varmints by Helen Ward and Mark Craste. We will be writing a discussion text based on the book next week, so we have been busy exploring the For and Against arguments of the text through drama and group discussions.





We finished our reading topic last week and the children enjoyed using their imaginations and showing off their creativity by making a journal of their own adventures based on the book Nine Worlds in Nine Days.





This week we have started a new 3-week topic of computing which the class have been very excited about! We are learning all about online safety, such as secure usernames and passwords, creating memes and posters, learning about whether all things posted on the internet are true and cyber bullying. We will also be learning how to do simple coding and programming during our computing topic.







World Book Day

A big thank you to all the children (and parents!) who helped to make World Book Day such a success this year. The theme was 'You Are a Reader' and I think all the children demonstrated just how much they love books by the creative and wonderful costumes that they wore. My particular favourite was the inflatable dinosaur who caused quite a stir on entering our assembly that morning! 


NORSE Meal Price Increase




