Look at what we have been learning this week...

We have had a fantastic half term in 3Athens. It was great to see the children return eager to secure their knowledge on column addition and subtraction in maths. We have been re-capping our skills on column addition with re-grouping and showing great resilience with our column subtraction with exchanging. In the photos, you can see the class applying their knowledge to real-life problem solving and using base-10 blocks to support their understanding.





This week, 3Athens have been learning about the Easter story and the significance of the cross to Christians. In particular, we have been focusing on our class station: when Jesus was removed from the cross. We have discussed how even when someone has died, we must still treat them with love and respect. In the photos, you can see the children making flowers to add to our class wreath to represent how people lay flowers at graves to show love, respect and remember the person who has died. In the photos, you can also see Mollie and Sophia researching further into the significance of the cross to Christians and creating a speech in preparation for our Easter Service on Thursday 31st March.











We Love Reading Competition Winners


