Over the coming week we will be embedding some clearer behaviour strategies to focus on positive learning behaviour which should help everyone with their school experiences.



Class Learning Blog – 3 Athens

Look at what we have been learning this week...

We have had a fantastic start to the new half term in 3Athens. It has been great to see the children returning with eagerness to learn and enthusiasm to work more on our topic on storytelling. We have been looking at the French short film 'Le Petite Cordonnier' and learning about the art of storytelling through different mediums such as puppet shows. In the photo you can see the children's sock puppets they created to get ready to re-tell the story through a puppet show performance.



During the last week of Autumn term 1, Athens class learnt about skeletons, muscles and nutrition. We labelled skeletons with their common and scientific names, sorted bones into their different functions, learned about how bones and muscles work together, how skeletons vary between animals and looked at nutrition and where it comes from. In the photos you can see a selection of the children's work and screenshots from our end of unit showcase 'The 3Athens Science Show!'.


