

Class Learning Blog – 3 Rome

Look at what we have been learning this week...

Our current science topic is Rocks and Fossils. We have been looking at different rock types and how they can be classified. We were given a selection of rocks and had to group them in various ways and justify our decisions. We found out that there are three basic rock types; igneous, metamorphic and sedimentary. We tried to work out which group our selection of rocks belonged to.

We also investigated the durability of rocks (we were looking at erosion). We were given a piece of granite, flint, chalk, slate and sandstone and had to create a fair test to rate these rocks according to their durability. We concluded that granite was the most durable and chalk the least.

Isla brought in her quite splendid collection of rocks and fossils and kindly shared them with the class. Her collection included a fossilised shark tooth, an ammonite and a meteorite. Mr Power was quite jealous of her collection.


